Ask

Enrol and attend your faculty induction

It's really important you enrol as that's when you officially become a BU student and get your student card. It's also the only way we can confirm you've arrived and tell sponsors and organisations like Student Finance England they can release your financial support.

Your induction is an essential introduction to your course and it's been planned to help you integrate with life here at BU. There will be a real mix of events all tailored to your course to get you off to a really good start. Your induction timetable will

Organise yourself

You'll be able to access your academic timetable just before the start of term, after you have registered online. Check the Arriving Students section of our website for instructions on setting up your timetable to view your lectures, seminars and learning sessions relevant to your course, like lab work or workshops. After Week One you'll also be able to view your timetable in our iBU app.



Where things happen



The BU Campuses

We are based over two campuses – Lansdowne Campus in the town centre and Talbot Campus just a 15-minute bus ride away. Go online for building addresses and postcodes to add to your GPS: www.bournemouth.ac.uk/building-addresses



BU buses

Our UNIBUS service connects our campus with Poole, Bournemouth and Boscombe, with the U1 service regularly running between our Talbot and Lansdowne sites, taking about 15 minutes.

You can purchase a bus pass ‘the key’ - a smartcard ticket which you can use on all the uni buses, as well as the local network by More Bus. You’ll also be able to access the bus timetable in our iBU mobile app.

Dylan’s

Based in Poole House, Talbot Campus, this is your Students’ Union bar. Whether you’re looking for some great food, a drink after lectures or meeting new people at one of the regular evening events, it’s a relaxing environment for all.

The Engine Room

Based at the Lansdowne Campus, and part of The Old Fire Station. During the day this is the perfect place to head for a coffee, somewhere different to work or enjoy some board games.

Fusion Building

This is our newest building and is home to the Create, Share and Inspire lecture theatres as well as flexible learning spaces, PC suites and the main university catering facilities.

Res Life

The Res Life team organise all sorts of events throughout the year, many of which will take place in your halls of residence or near your UniLet home. Check out the posters around your halls and the Res Life Facebook groups which you can join.

The Student Centre

This is your hub of almost everything SUBU related. This is where the main SUBU offices are, including those of your five elected full-time officers, as well as a café and a juice bar and the Nerve Media studios. This is also where you can sign up to over 100 clubs and societies (or start your own). SUBU Advice is based here too. SUBU also has an office in Studland House on the Lansdowne Campus.

The local area

Students will be giving a tour of Bournemouth town centre on Sunday 21 January, showing you the best places to shop, get a coffee and enjoy a night out. All you need to do is turn up at the meeting point – check page 7 of this guide for details.

Trips and tours

Explore with trips around the local area, to places like Stonehenge, the Isle of Wight and the Jurassic Coast, and to towns and cities such as London, Oxford, Bath and Winchester. BU jargon buster

Whether you're new to the UK or not, we use a lot of terms and phrases that are unique to BU. Here's a helpful guide to the most common phrases and acronyms you're likely to encounter.

ALS: Additional Learning Support – read the Study section in this guide for how the team can help

BUCS: British Universities & Colleges Sport

Campus Sport: Programmes, activities and opportunities for all levels of abilities

CEMP: Centre for Excellence in Media Production

EBC: Executive Business Centre – this is a learning space at the Lansdowne Campus, mainly used by postgraduate students on Faculty of Management courses.

Faculty: This is the title used for the four main academic areas of BU, and your course will be aligned to at least one of them – possibly two if you're studying a joint honours course.

FM: The abbreviation for the Faculty of Management.

FMC: The abbreviation for the Faculty of Media & Communication.

HE: Higher Education – BU is a Higher Education provider.

HoD: Head of Department – this is a member of staff who oversees the management of your course.

HSS: The abbreviation for the Faculty of Health & Social Sciences.

IAT: International Admissions Team – many of you will have applied via this team.

LLS: Library and Learning Support – this team organise a range of study support such as PAL and the Study Skills community.

NUS: National Union of Students.

OAC: Open Access Centre – these are computer labs that are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There's one in Poole House, Talbot Campus and another in Studland House, Lansdowne Campus.

PAL: Peer-Assisted Learning – a scheme where current students offer advice and support – find out more in the Study section of this guide.

PGR: Postgraduate Research level of study e.g. PhD.

PGT: Postgraduate Taught level of study e.g. Masters.

Programme: This is another name for your course e.g. your programme of study is BSc (Hons) Business Studies.

PST: Programme Support Team – they are there to help you with any administration support you may need throughout your course.

RAG: Raising and Giving – fundraising activities organised by SUBU.

SciTech: The abbreviation for the Faculty of Science & Technology.

Student Handbook: This will be given to you when you enrol and contains course information for your current year of study.

SUBU Elected Officers: These are recent BU graduates who have been elected by the student body to represent student views to the university.

SUBU: Students' Union at Bournemouth University.

UG: Undergraduate level of study e.g. BA (Hons), BSc (Hons), FDA, FDSC.

VC: Vice Chancellor – this is the title for the head of any university. Your VC is Prof John Vinney.

Room numbers

To help you find the room you're looking for here's how we assign room numbers at BU: The first letter tells you which building the room is in. The next letter or number tells you which floor. So, BG14 is on the ground floor of Bournemouth House and P403 is on the 4th floor of Poole House.
